

Readings for Lent: Gospel of Mark

I find a quiet place, become present to the Lord and ask the grace to be open and receptive.

1. I read the passage slowly, noticing words or phrases which catch my attention. I ask: What does this passage say to my head? (What do I think about?)
2. I read the passage again: I ask: What does this passage say to my heart? (How am I drawn to / away from the Lord? Or others?)
3. I read the passage again: I ask: What does this passage say to my hands? (What will I do now?)
4. I speak to the Lord about what you have heard.... I conclude with the Lord's Prayer.
