## Social Responsibility - Modern Slavery



#### CTIC's support of Jo Phillips and her work with Modern Slavery.

Jo has recently been awarded a grant by the Bishop Radford Trust which is enabling her to organise another Cumbria Modern Slavery Champions Network event. The following excerpt from her grant application describes the work she has been involved in.

There have been recent disappointments too, with the closure of the Cumbria Modern Slavery & Exploitation Partnership (mentioned below). County steering group dealings with the issue have been relocated to the more general Cumbria Serious Organised Crime Alliance. We hope to continue engagement and assistance in dealing with the issue from this new setting.

Modern Slavery and exploitation are pernicious issues affecting every area of the country. Cumbria is no exception and has some specific issues of vulnerability due to prominent industries, geographic and population factors. Yet until January 2024 it was one of the few counties not to have a Modern Slavery Partnership.

Due to the work of the Social Responsibility Forum we had built relationships with many who encounter this issue on the frontline, and with those who are in a position to make a difference to those most vulnerable, and victims. With the help of experts in national networks (such as that of The Clewer Initiative, and the Human Trafficking Foundation) we organised network training events and gathered a group of those willing to start a Partnership. A weakness in previous attempts to do this was the lack of dissemination of information, resources, reporting and referral pathways. A network of frontline workers addresses this weakness and enables more effective action against modern slavery and exploitation in our region.

We have set up the Cumbria Modern Slavery Champions Network to be the vehicle for this. We send out monthly emails with information and resources, and we organise network training events to gather these people together to learn, to discuss, to network amongst themselves, to gather feedback on what is being encountered on the ground and are able to pass that to the Partnership. While the Partnership are able to effectively feed plans and information to those who need it most in the region.

The network has nearly 200 members, but many disseminate further to their own teams from there. It is made up of 40 organisations, statutory bodies, third sector, faith communities and members of the public. It benefits them, but also

all those whom they serve in turn, ensuring they know how to report, refer and care for victims.

Our Aims and Objectives are:

- 1. To raise awareness of the situation in the region and beyond
- 2.To equip and inform those dealing with the issue in their various spheres
- 3.To encourage and support multi-agency relationships and collaborative working
- 4.To improve care and support of victims/survivors of modern slavery
- 5.To significantly reduce and prevent exploitation and modern slavery

#### Our Mission Statement is:

Getting to Work on Modern Slavery in Cumbria

We hope the next Network event will take place in late May. We'll share further details as soon as we have them.

## **Anna Chaplaincy**



This last month has been an exciting time for Anna Chaplaincy in Cumbria as we welcome three more Anna Chaplains and six more Anna Friends.

In Natland, on the 9th February, Gill Pilling was commissioned as Anna Chaplain at St Marks church in a service led by Reverend Shanthi Thompson and Reverend Lucy Foster. Gill comes with a wealth of experience as a retired GP who specialised in palliative care and care of the elderly. Aside from her Anna Chaplaincy work, she is part of a pioneering project to take medicines out to Malawi where she supports a Palliative Care Clinic, by taking much needed crucial medicines with her. Gill also volunteers at the Royal Lancaster Infirmary as a chaplain.

The Reverend Christine Brown has commissioned six new Anna Friends in the last couple of months to help her with the ministry in Sedbergh and Dent. They will also work alongside Christine in the chaplaincy work at Kendal hospital.

Grassmoor Mission Community are preparing to commission Reverend Nicholas Cole as an Anna Chaplain on the 8th March on GMC leadership day, and Reverend Ruth Illman on the 16th March at St Mary's, Harrington.



#### New Guidance for Local Ecumenical Partnerships (LEPS)

New guidance is now available for LEPs who are considering the registration of their buildings for same sex marriages. This guidance has been put together by the National Ecumenical Officers of the Church of England, United Reformed Church, Baptist Church and Methodist Church, who are the four denominations that are involved in a majority of churches that are Local Ecumenical Partnerships. Importantly, a number of other denominations are also partners within LEPs, this guidance aims to clarify the different rules for LEPs that include the four churches that were involved in writing it, and offers a starting point for these discussions where they are happening in local contexts.
